2025-2026 Winter Lighting for SoHo Broadway District

### Introduction

The SoHo Broadway District Management Association, Inc., doing business as the <u>SoHo Broadway Initiative</u> (the "Initiative"), is a not-for-profit tax-exempt organization that represents the neighborhood-focused business improvement district for SoHo's Broadway from Houston Street to Canal Street (the "District"). The Initiative's mission is to foster a unique, vibrant, mixed-use district with enhanced maintenance and public safety, effective advocacy and administration, technical and professional services for its members, and strategic capital improvements. The Initiative seeks to make SoHo Broadway a welcoming place to live in, work in, and visit.

The Initiative is seeking proposals from qualified firms (or teams of firms) by this request to provide services outlined in the Scope of Work to design, fabricate, install, store, and maintain winter lighting for the Broadway corridor between Houston Street and Canal Street.

### Scope of Work

The SoHo Broadway Initiative intends to produce its first ever winter light installation in the winter of 2025-2026. The goal of this project is to bring joy to the neighborhood and enliven the public realm while paying homage to the unique identity, culture, history, and built environment of the neighborhood. The lighting installation will also serve as an amenity for businesses, workers, residents, visitors, and other district stakeholders.

The light installation will be on display from November 2025 through February 2026 and The Initiative intends to reinstall these lights in future winter seasons. Proposals may include costs for up to three additional years of display. The Initiative shall have the sole option to extend this contract on an annual basis for up to three additional years, to be exercised by giving the contractor written notice.

The contractor(s) will propose the type, number, and style of lights to be installed. Lighting elements affixed to street light poles can by powered by standard 110v outlets on these light poles. There are 17 poles within the District on Broadway and cross streets just off Broadway that may be eligible for decorative lighting installation, as shown in Attachment B. Power solutions for other types of installations should be included in the proposal. In addition to light poles, The Initiative would consider lighting in existing planters in curb extensions (15 in total; see Attachment D), new elements in place of current planters, projections and projection mapping, or other proposals made by respondents. For purposes of proposal, assume elements cannot be affixed to private property (although opportunities for such could be identified during project development process).

## Vendors will be required to:

- a. Provide licensed personnel to perform work in a safe and timely manner
- b. Secure necessary city approvals in close partnership with the Initiative

- c. Install and remove all equipment
- d. Conduct working tests to ensure functionality
- e. Provide maintenance and repairs during the length of the program, as needed
- f. Provide proof of adequate insurance coverage

The Initiative hopes to select a contractor for winter lighting by January 2025.

## **Budget**

The Initiative has budgeted up to \$120,000 for all project elements including design, fabrication, installation, removal, and storage for the first year of this project. Estimated fees for each component should be outlined in the proposal.

#### **Art Direction**

Lighting elements must be unique to SoHo and in conversation with either its history, built environment, architecture, or some combination thereof. The Initiative sees this as an artistic lighting installation to brighten the dark winter months. Installations must also be visually appealing in the daytime hours. The diverse groups who live, work, shop, and enjoy the neighborhood should as well inspiration from SoHo's unique cast iron architecture, history as a commercial and industrial district, legacy as a pioneering art neighborhood, and continued identity as a center of fashion, style and creative industries should be considered in proposed designs. Design inspiration words include: artistic, interesting, inspiring, iconic, innovative, cutting-edge, contemporary, "outside the box," whimsical, playful, creative, unique, special, atypical, site-specific, bespoke, classy, elegant, stylish, and industrial.

#### **RFP Submission Process**

- Agreement will begin at the time of selection (approximately February 2025) and last through the deinstallation and move to storage (approximately February 2026).
  - The agreement will include option to extend on an annual basis for up to three (3) additional years.

## Proposals must include:

- a. Company Name, Primary Contact, Address, Phone, and Email.
- b. Description and concept drawings/images of the type of lighting proposed.
- c. A detailed scope of work and schedule including a description of the tasks to be performed and the means to be used to accomplish these tasks.
- d. Documentation of the firm's/team's experience providing similar services including references (at least three).
- e. Resumes of key project staff.
- f. Comprehensive fee proposal including cost of design, prototyping, fabrication, installation, removal, maintenance, and storage should be provided.

### **Selection Process:**

While the Initiative will give preference to proposals that include execution of all components of this project, we will also consider proposals that address only the lighting design portion of this RFP. Currently, the street poles have decorative banners

attached. While we would prefer proposals that allow us to continue to display these banners through the time period of the lighting display, we would consider proposal that require the banners to be temporarily removed.

The Initiative will select the respondent which, in the sole judgment of the Initiative, most successfully demonstrates the necessary qualities to undertake the project, offers the most cost-effective proposal, and best meets the needs and goals of the Initiative. The Initiative may award a contract to the firm whose proposal is deemed to be most advantageous to the Initiative, in the Initiative's sole discretion.

The Initiative will not pay any costs incurred by any firm in responding to this RFP. The review or selection of a submission will create no legal relationship or equitable rights in favor of a Respondent, including, without limitation, rights of enforcement or reimbursement.

Interviews may be held with any or all of the Respondents after the receipt of the submissions. Interviews with The Initiative will be scheduled after initial review of the proposals.



















